Holland Township Community Center



For the last decade Holland Charter Township elected officials have been envisioning a community center. The right time to implement the project has come through a redevelopment opportunity at the former Westshore Mall.

The Shops at Westshore-Transformation

Even the most casual observer traveling on US-31 has noticed the significant changes that have occurred at the former Westshore Mall. The current mall owner (Versa Real Estate) has followed the recipe for revitalizing the traditional enclosed mall by incorporating uses other than retail such as institutional (Grand Rapids Community College- Lakeshore Campus), services (FedEx/Indi Suites), governmental (West Michigan Works!) and entertainment (Urban Air/X-Golf). With the addition of the community center, the site is nearly full. The owner also plans to add housing to the site. These existing and planned uses create a great synergy for the community center.



A Community Center for All

The community center will occupy 55,000 square feet of the former Younker's department store. The township has retained TowerPinkster for architectural services and GDK Construction to serve as construction manager. This talented team is helping the township bring to reality the goal of creating a facility that all residents can enjoy.

Athletic and Non-athletic Uses

Plans call for the construction of a regulation-size basketball court, six pickleball courts and multipurpose rooms suitable for a variety of fitness and non-fitness activities. The mezzanine level will have an elevated walking track and open areas for cardio workouts and strengthening activities.



The design includes a community room suitable for classes, corporate events/meetings and private social events. A small plaza adjacent to the community room will add an outdoor element when the weather is pleasant. Other amenities for users include a lounge, lockers and changing areas. Approximately 8,100 square feet has been reserved for future expansion.



Demolition at the site began in mid-November. The project is scheduled to be completed and open for use in late spring/early summer of 2025. The project is expected to cost approximately \$15 million.

Snow Removal Ordinance

Homeowners are responsible for removing snow in front of their driveways.

Be aware that shoveling or plowing snow from driveways onto or across roads is illegal, because it can present a serious traffic hazard to motorists. Instead, pile the snow behind the curb or shoulder on your side of the road.

Additionally, do not plow snow onto bike paths, which must remain clear for safe travel at all times. Be sure to place snow to



the right as you face the road, so plows will push it away from, rather than back into, the driveway entrance. It is also important to avoid creating vision obstructions. Care should also be taken not to impede the flow of storm water from melting snow in the ditches or culverts.

Citizens should also make certain that their trash containers are not placed too close to the edge of the road before snow removal has taken place, and should also know that it is the responsibility of the property owner to keep areas in front of mailboxes clear for mail delivery.

No Street Parking

Street parking is not permitted in Holland Charter Township at any time. The vast majority of streets in the Township are public streets and are under the control of the Ottawa County Road Commission. The Ottawa County Road Commission applies Michigan Vehicle Code Act 300 of 1949 [as amended in 2016] for the regulation of public streets. Additionally, the Township does not allow parking on an unimproved surface such as a front yard or in the

grass adjacent to the road. If you have any questions about parking or driveway improvements, please contact the Township.

Register Rental Property by February 15

All rental properties must be registered with the Township annually on or before **February 15**. Newly constructed or newly converted rental units need to be registered within 30 days. A rental unit which is sold, transferred or conveyed needs to be registered by the new owner. Register to Vote

You can register to vote at the <u>Clerk's office</u>, <u>County Clerk's office</u>, or <u>Secretary of State branch office</u>. If you are registering less than 15 days before an election, you must register to vote at the Township Clerk's office. Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on election day. Request an Absent Voter Ballot

Your request for an absent voter ballot must be in writing and can be submitted to the Township Clerk. You must request an absent voter ballot by submitting the application, a letter, a postcard, or a pre-printed application form obtained from the Clerk's office. Requests may be returned in person, via postal mail or email, as long as a signature is visible.

Permanent Absentee Voter List

If you are already on the Permanent Absentee Voter List, applications will be mailed to you in January.

Early Voting Centers Set to Launch in 2024

Ottawa County voters will have additional options for casting their ballot in state and federal elections coming up in 2024, beginning with the Presidential Preference Primary in February. In September 2023, a plan was presented by Ottawa County Clerk Justin Roebuck in collaboration with 23 City and Township Clerks to collectively implement early voting.

The County Clerk's Office as well as all local jurisdictional clerks are working hard to ensure that Ottawa County residents have a secure, cost-effective, and customer friendly early voting process.

Here's what to expect:

Early voting will be conducted at four vote center locations across the county, where any resident may cast a ballot at any vote center. These locations will be:

- Polkton Township Hall: 6900 Arthur St., Coopersville
- Georgetown Township Hall: 1515 Baldwin St., Jenison
- Grand Haven Township Hall: 13300 168th Ave., Grand Haven
- MDHHS Building Macatawa Room: 12185 James St., Holland

Voters will have nine additional days prior to each state and federal election where they may cast their ballot just as they would on Election Day. The hours of operation for Ottawa County's Early Voting Centers will be:

- Saturday: 7am-3pm • Sunday: 7am-3pm Monday: 7am-3pm
- Tuesday: 11am-7pm
- Wednesday: 7am-3pm Thursday: 11am-7pm
- Friday: 7am-3pm • Saturday: 7am-3pm
- Sunday: 7am-3pm Monday: No voting
- Tuesday: Federal or State Election Day Vote at precinct location: 7am-8pm
