March Board of Review

Assessment Notices will be mailed out on February 16^{th} , 2023, regarding the Assessed and Taxable Values for the 2023 Tax Roll.

The Taxable Value, Assessed Value, State Equalized Value, Property Classification or Transfer of Ownership may be appealed by filing a protest with the Local Board of Review. Protests are made to the Board of Review by completing a Board of Review Petition Form. A Petition form may be obtained directly from the Township or from the State Tax Commissioner's website.

You may also review tax information at the Holland Charter Township Offices (353 N. 120th Ave., Holland, MI 49424) during business hours (Monday - Friday, 8:00 am - 5:00 pm) or call (616) 395-0236.

Leaf & Yard Waste Recycling

Guidelines for Recycling Services:

- Materials accepted are grass clippings, leaves, brush, branches, and limbs (up to 12" diameter).
- Brush must be separated from grass clippings and leaves.
- No plastic, contaminates, treated lumber or stumps accepted.
- Customer is responsible for unloading and separating recycling materials.
- No commercial vehicles for these recycling services.
- These leaf and yard waste recycling services are open to Holland Charter Township residents without a drop off fee during the dates specified.
- Proof of residency may be requested.

<u>11531 Lakewood Boulevard</u>, between 120th and 112th Avenues (first driveway east of Action Supply at 11560 Lakewood Boulevard).

Materials that will NOT be accepted:

Paints, drain oils, solvents and other petroleum products, fuel tanks, sealed containers. Household garbage, loose roofing materials (must be boxed or bagged), boats larger than 12 feet long.

PLEASE NOTE: Lawn and yard waste, branches, and tree stumps **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED**.

Accepted Materials for Disposal:

Furniture, appliances, batteries, automobile tires (limit of 4 per household). Electronic equipment including computers, printers, TV's, monitors, audio equipment and electronic power tools.

Accepted Materials for Recycling:

Household recyclables: paper, plastics, tin cans, etc.

Proof of residency is required.

The Township reserves the right to refuse any items that are deemed too large or too difficult to handle.

Register to Vote

You can register to vote at the <u>Clerk's office</u>, <u>County Clerk's office</u>, or <u>Secretary of State branch office</u>, or <u>online at the SOS</u> through April 17. **After April 17**, **you must register** in person at the local Clerk's office to be eligible to vote in this election.

Voters who register to vote in person with their city or township clerk during the 14 days prior to the election, including on



Election Day, must show proof of residency.

Absentee Ballots

A voter who wishes to receive an absentee ballot must request it in writing from the clerk; absentee ballots may not be delivered as a result of an oral request made in person or over the phone. However, an absentee ballot application form may be provided as a result of an oral request.

The written request may be on a form supplied by the clerk, Secretary of State, or any government or non-government organization, on a letter or postcard, or on the online AV request tool at Michigan.Gov/Vote. Any written request that includes the applicant's name and signature must be accepted. Applications for absent voter ballots may be received by hand, via postal mail, fax, email, or online, as long as the voter's signature is visible.

Clerk's Office Saturday Hours

The Clerk's office will also be open **Saturday**, **April 29 from 7:00 am - 3:00 pm** to accept Absentee Voter Ballot requests.

On that day voters may vote at the township office or take the ballot with them.

Absentee Ballot Deadlines

The last day the Clerk's office can mail absentee ballots is **Friday**, **April 28**. You may request an absentee ballot by coming into the office, **until 4:00 p.m. on Monday**, **May 1**. Any ballots requested on May 1 must be voted in the office. All absentee ballots must be returned by 8:00 p.m. on election day in order to count. Voters registering to vote on election day may request an absentee ballot until 8 pm, however, they must vote the ballot in the office.

Holland Charter Township Recognized for Supporting Small Businesses

Holland Charter Township has been recognized for its contributions to Michigan's entrepreneurial growth and economic development. The annual eCities study, conducted by researchers at iLabs, University of Michigan-Dearborn's Center for Innovation, designated Holland Charter Township as a five-star community along with 94 other communities across the state.

The eCities study analyzed publicly available data from 277 communities from 54 counties in Michigan. Researchers focused on the five-year changes in property values, community assets, and tax rates, which can demonstrate the growth, investments, and cost of doing business within the community. For example, over the five-year period of 2017-2021, these communities increased their capital assets by an average of 3.4% per year by investments such as new libraries, new community centers, and infrastructure improvements. Further, these places are home to 86% of Michigan's real commercial property and have 64% of the state's total property value.

Short Term Rentals

Short Term Rentals such as VRBO, Airbnb, Homestay, and individual room rentals within a dwelling are not permitted in Holland Charter Township. Properties that offer stays of 14 consecutive days or less with the owner/operator on the premises may apply to operate a Bed and Breakfast with an approved Special Land Use Permit.

Special Land Use Permit Application

Properties that offer stays of 15 consecutive days or more shall participate in the rental inspection program.

Chickens in Residential Areas

Holland Township does not allow chickens or farm animals on residential zoned properties.

Farm animals and chickens are only permitted on conforming lots in the AG zoning district; with at least five acres. Operations shall be compliant with all applicable State of Michigan Generally Accepted Agricultural and Management Practices.

Road Construction Projects Scheduled for the 2023 Construction Season



The Ottawa County Road Commission has published a list of projects that are planned for the 2023 construction season. As dates become available they will be posted on the Ottawa County Road Commission website.

- Chicago Drive & 8th Street (US-31 to City Limits) Mill and resurface
- 104th Avenue (Adams Street to BL-196) Mill and resurface and 2 paved shoulders
- 96th Avenue Bridge (over Black River Tributary) Replacement
- 144th Street (Shadybrook Drive to Riley Street) Resurface

Holland Charter Township will be replacing a watermain that was installed in the 1970's in the area of Paw Paw Dr., 104th Ave., and Chicago Dr. This project is anticipated to occur during the 2023 construction season.
